## 9(a-5) Visa for Filmmaking Visitors

Kindly prepare the printed documents in the following order. Please do not staple the documents, paper clips may be used to keep the documents in order.

- Printed copy of the duly filled-out visa application form with passport size photo taken within the last six (6) months with plain white background
- Original and photocopy of passport valid for at least six (6) months beyond the authorized period of stay
- Original and photocopy of Hong Kong Identification Card (HKID)
- Tickets or flight reservation (entry and exit)
- Letter of request addressed to the International Press Center
- Background of film outfit
- Curriculum Vitae of the filmmaker, including a shortlist of work credits
- Synopsis/storyline of the film
- Itinerary of activities
- List of members of the crew with designations (if any)
- Employment certificate or contract from the film outfit
- List of equipment with certification from the film outfit that said equipment will be re-exported at the end of the trip to the Philippines
- Hotel accommodation or proof of lodging

## IMPORTANT:

- Personal appearance of the applicant is required for the submission of the documents.
- The Visa Officer may require other supporting documents from the applicant depending on the evaluation of the visa application. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- All documents in any foreign language must be submitted with English translation.
- Some cases require an authority from the Department of Foreign Affairs of the Philippines in Manila prior to the issuance of a visa. In such cases, the processing time will take 7 to 10 business days upon receipt of the applicant's printed documents.
- Foreign nationals with no nationality indicated on their passport must submit a visa application at least two (2) months before their intended date of travel to the Philippines

since prior approval from the Department of Foreign Affairs of the Philippines in Manila is required before a visa can be issued. Please do not purchase airline tickets unless and until the visa has been approved. Flight reservations may be submitted in lieu of a confirmed flight booking when submitting the documents to the Consulate.
